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The Emergency Medical Technician Program at the College of Southern Idaho offers Emergency Medical Technician and Advanced Emergency Medical Technician paths of study. Both Postsecondary and Technical Certificates are available. EMT and Advanced EMT Lecture courses are offered in face to face or online formats. Labs are offered in a state-of-the-art learning facility where students master required emergency skills. All courses are approved by the State of Idaho EMS Bureau and successful graduates of the program qualify to take the National Registry of EMTs Certification exam. Applying to this program is a separate application process from applying to the College or declaring your major.
