Education

In-service training was completed Jan. 4. Staff were trained on various topics to include: Motivational Interviewing, Parent/Child Relationships and Families as Lifelong Educators, Communication Training, Child Development, CACFP changes, Hands on Bus Driving, Immunizations, Applications and Child Plus Data Base, Child Nutrition, Processing Receipts and Bills and Budgeting and Payroll (provided by the CSI Business Office staff). The second family staffing will begin this month.

Disabilities

The program will be reaching its midpoint for the school year the week of January 25. Per performance standard, we are supposed to have 10% of our available slots enrolled by children on an IEP or IFSP. For CSI Head Start/Early Head Start that would mean we had 67 children. At this point however, we currently have 41. We have 28 children that have been referred to their local school districts for testing and the program is waiting on those results. Additionally, the program has seen a number of children enrolled in the program with an IEP either drop, because they were moving or other family circumstances and/or we have also experienced children testing out of their IEP's during the program year. Both examples directly effect the program's ability to reach and maintain the percentage required. It is certainly a frustrating challenge that we continue to monitor and track.

Training

On February 9-10, 2015, the <u>Idaho Association for the Education of Young Children</u>, <u>Idaho Head Start Association</u> and <u>Idaho Voices for Children</u> are joining hands as we hold our first Early Learning Legislative Day.

We are inviting all of our members from across the state to participate in what will be a very engaging and exciting day. This is an excellent opportunity to partner with other early childhood advocates, parents and educators to show your support for quality early

learning in Idaho!

The 2 day(s) will consist of:

The Raising of America Screening (Lincoln Auditorium) Community-wide free event to raise awareness of the importance of early learning and to take action towards a better future for all children. *The Raising of America* is an ambitious documentary series that seeks to reframe the way we look at early learning.

BLOCK Fest (Idaho State Capitol Rotunda) is a research based, hands-on exhibit developed in Idaho to provide an interactive block-building experience for young children and their parents. The experience has been shown to increase parent knowledge of early development in the areas of math and science education while providing opportunities to increase social skills and literacy opportunities for young children. BLOCK Fest is active in 12 states

Early Learning Rally (Idaho State Capitol) at the Capitol. The intent is to send a message to our state legislators that high-quality early learning is a priority issue and is critical to the future of our youngest children and their families.

Presentations to the Education and Health and Welfare Committees throughout the day. Pediatricians Noreen Womack and Priscilla Salant from the McClure Center will be speaking to committee members about early brain development, learning environments in Idaho and investing in early learning.

Meet with Your Legislator! The freedom to speak to your legislator is a right and a privilege. We will be setting up meetings for each of you to speak with your district representative. These meetings will be a great opportunity for you to personally connect with your legislator and share your stories about the importance of early learning. Whether you are a parent, educator or an advocate, our legislators need to hear from their constituents.

The College of Southern Idaho Head Start/Early Head Start program will be sending staff and parents to this conference, the number TBD.

Re: Purchase of the Riedesel Building

The Southern Idaho Development Center or "C" wing of the Evergreen Building was constructed in 1990 and is in need of renovation. The building is made up of approximately 9,400 square feet if the two telecommunication rooms are excluded. Prior to completing the renovation, the best educational use of this building will also be evaluated since it is located in the core of the campus.

A major issue concerning an extensive renovation is the need to relocate the existing tenants of the building for an extended period of time. The renovation will involve a new HVAC system, new windows, ceiling grid, LED lighting and floor coverings at a minimum. Due the redesign for educational spaces, interior walls may have to be removed and new ones constructed. Essentially, depending on the final design, the building may have to be totally gutted. The cost for this renovation may run as high as \$150 per square foot or \$1,500,000.

The C Wing of the Evergreen building is currently housing the College of Southern Idaho Small Business Development Center, Region IV Development, three dedicated Idaho State University classrooms, an Idaho State University double office, a College of Southern Idaho Business Department Computer Lab and an overflow classroom.

We were advised the Reidesel building located at 202 Falls Avenue is available for sale. The building has 5,064 square feet on the main floor and a 448 square foot basement for a total of 5,585 square feet. It is on a lot area of 20,730 square feet in an L shape. The original building was constructed in 1999 with an addition completed in 2002. The property is zoned R4 Professional Overlay.

The property would easily house both the College of Southern Idaho Small Business Development Center and Region IV Development. The remaining Idaho State University areas and the College of Southern Idaho computer lab would have to be reassigned to existing spaces on campus. Part of the property is also leased to Senator Crapo for 928.62 per month. When the lease renewal comes up, there may have to be some additional security measures put in place before the lease can be renewed.

Doug Volmer appraised the property and lot at approximately \$625,000. We have had the property inspected by Bill Baker and received a report of building related concerns and issues to address. Allen Scherbinske and Randy Dill have reviewed the building inspection report and found no significant issues that would cause us concern in purchasing the building. Numerous small items can be addressed, including the installation of new windows, for approximately \$15,000. Additionally, some remodel work and the finishing out of approximately 800 square feet of storage space could cost as much as \$35,000.

The owners of the property have accepted our offer of \$550,000 for the building as is. With the maintenance and remodel work, our total investment in the building will be in the \$600,000 range. Based upon our need to relocate existing on campus tenants for the renovation of the C Wing of the Evergreen Building and the Reidesel buildings suitability and proximity to campus, I respectfully request permission to purchase the Reidesel building for \$550,000 plus miscellaneous negotiated closing costs.

Funding for this purchase is from the Plant Facility Fund.

Re: Sale of House – 703 Field Stream Way

We entered into an agreement with Irwin Realty to sell two of our residential construction program houses in November of 2014. We have an offer for the house located at 703 Field Stream Way. The 2,080 square foot house is approximately four years old. Previously the house was rented but the house has remained empty this past year.

The offer for the house is for \$210,000 which is two thousand below the appraised price. After closing costs and real estate commissions, the college will receive approximately \$192,000 to \$194,000 for the property.

Based upon the current market conditions, the appraisal dated October 22, 2014 and the comparable sales of similar houses in the area, I respectfully request permission from the Board to sell the residential construction house located at 703 Field Stream Way.

Proceeds from the sale will be deposited into the Plant Facility Fund where the original construction costs for the house were charged.
