CALL TO ORDER: 8:00 P.M.

MINUTES: The Minutes of the May 18 meeting of the Board of Trustees were approved as

written, upon MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Report of the Treasurer, consisting of the May Fund Report, and the updated 1970 FY Budget Analysis covering the 12 months of the fiscal year, were submitted for Board review.

Upon MOTION by Mr. Shields, seconded by Mr. Evans, both were approved

and accepted as submitted.

AUTHORIZATION TO PAY BILLS: A MOTION was made by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock and carried, that the Board of Trustees approve payment of bills, transfer of funds, and acknowledge payrolls as follows: Bills: \$41,004.74 (this excludes a bill of \$1,500.00 from Brizee, and adds one for \$2,266.19 from Home Plumbing); Transfers: \$5,989.15; and May Payrolls: Regular, \$79,541.07, Work Study, \$5,489.45.

BIDS ACCEPTANCE APPROVED: The Business Manager reported that bids were opened on May 18, 1970, for furnishing to the College certain items of equipment for the new H & PE Building. Four bids were received for the PE equipment of which one was rejected because the bidder bid non-comparable equipment; and three were received for the washer and dryer.

The lowest and best bidders appeared to be Idaho Sporting Goods in the amount of \$6,135.15 for the PE equipment; and Idaho Equipment Company in the amount of \$3,030.00 for the washer and dryer plus approximately \$210.00 for the cost of converting to different voltages other than what the machines were designed for.

Upon MOTION by Mr. Garrabrandt, seconded by Mr. Blastock, the Board accepted the two bids noted above, and approved the purchase of the equipment.

Other bids opened recently included those for microfilming equipment, for which only two bids were received. It was decided to take this matter under advisement until a later meeting, because of some undetermined factors involved.

PERSONNEL - RESIGNATIONS/TERMINATIONS: It was noted the following listed persons have terminated employment with the College: Sharlot Hilliard, Maintenance Clerk-Typist; Mary Ronnberg, Business Office Clerk-Typist; and James Adams, Student Counselor.

A MOTION by Mr. Evans, seconded by Mr. Blastock, accepted the resignations and/or terminations of these employees.

OLD AND NEW BUSINESS: Dr. Taylor told the Board of the rather extensive remodeling and renovation program at the Clarence Nye Building to house the RN Program.

The College is doing the work, the owner furnishing the material.

1970 Election of Trustees - Can it be held in conjunction with the general election this fall. Attorney Alexander advised No.

<u>Dr. Taylor</u> reported the H & PE Building is about 80% complete; the Multi-Use, 50%; and the Residence Hall, 45%.

Cost of Vocational-Technical Building will by estimate exceed the committed funds (State, \$250,000; Federal, \$214,000) by \$80,000 to \$100,000. Alternatives are: (1) redesign to reduce construction cost of the building; (2) request supplemental funds from the State Permanent Building Funds, or (3) commit institutional funds sufficient to cover the difference.

No decision was made on the route to take on the Vo-Tech fund problem.

<u>Vocational Construction</u> - Dr. Taylor asked the Board for permission to request from Dr. Don Kline of the State Board of Higher Education and from the State Director of Vocational Education at least \$1,500,000 for construction of vocational buildings on the College of Southern Idaho campus.

Upon MOTION by Mr. Garrabrandt, seconded by Mr. Blastock, the Board granted the permission and concurred in the idea.

CAMPUS TOUR: Dr. Taylor invited the Board members and the Housing Commission to join in a tour of new construction on campus, starting at 10:30 A.M., Monday, June 22, and conclude with lunch at the Holiday Inn.

The invitation was accepted.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:00 P.M.
