Bids:

1. The Board approved the bid of Anasazi Instruments of Indianapolis, Indiana in the amount of \$49,925.00 for the specified upgrade of the nuclear magnetic resonance spectrometer on MOTION by Bill Babcock. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

Funding for this purchase is from three sources: \$25,000 from the Camille and Henry Dreyfus Foundation, \$6,250 from the College of Southern Idaho Foundation \$18,675 is from the instructional budget.

- 2. The Board approved the bid of Silver Creek Supply of Hailey, Idaho in the amount of \$27,522.59 for the specified surface water pumping station on MOTION by Dr. Thad Scholes. Affirmative vote was unanimous.
- 3. The Board approved the low bid of Conner Creek Computers in the amount of \$60,024.00 for fifty computers in various configurations on MOTION by Dr. Charles Lehrman. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

The Board also approved the purchase of up to twenty additional computers under this contracted price.

Funding for this purchase is from various departmental budgets.

4. The Board approved the low bid of Greener Valley Computers in the amount of \$13,290.00 for the twelve computers specified by ARTEC on MOTION by Donna Brizee. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

Funding for this purchase is from the ARTEC Albertson's grant.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

1. The Board was advised that the Dormitory Housing Commission approved the pricing proposal of Fine Host Corporation for contracted food service. Room and board rates approved by the Dormitory Housing Commission for the 2000-2001 school year were also discussed.

- 2. Bob Lowder gave a report to the Board concerning the Breckenridge Agriculture Endowment. He discussed the proposed tree farm and the sugar beet contract with the University of Idaho.
- 3. Human Resource Director Barbara Knudson discussed the proposed College of Southern Idaho Drug and Alcohol testing policy with the Board. The policy addressed testing for reasonable cause and after an accident. Dr. Charles Lehrman discussed testing ten percent of employees each year.

The policy passes as written on MOTION by Bill Babcock. Affirmative vote was unanimous.

- 4. Martin Powell from ZGA Architects updated the Board on the plans for the Fine Arts Addition. The new theater, including the balcony area, is designed to have 390 seats.
- 5. The President updated the Board on legislative and funding issues. He discussed the proposed changes in the retirement system, funding for the Fine Arts Addition, state guidelines for salary increases and the state appropriation for academic and technical education.
- 6. The President advised the Board that Sam Haws, a newly appointed member of the State Board of Education, agreed to be our graduation speaker.

Based upon a review of the bids by Dr. Ken Campbell and Gary Baum, I recommend we accept the low bid of Conner Creek Computers of Burley, Idaho in the amount of \$60,024.00 for fifty computers in eighteen different configurations.

We also request permission to add up to twenty additional computers to this bid upon further discussion with program managers.

Funding for this purchase is from various departmental budgets. Approximately 15 of these computers are for the student computer lab in the library and 15 are for the Academic Development Center. The remaining twenty, most of which are computer upgrades, are for departments throughout the campus.

CSI Breckenridge Ag Endowment Farm Report to Trustees March 2000

Overview

The Breckenridge Ag Endowment Farm continues to be a positive influence for students in the CSI Agriculture Program and for the program. Developments during the past two years include:

- Five-year lease for rhizomania research
- Grass pasture development and plans
- Wetland activities and research
- Student Farm Managers

Five-year lease for Rhizomania Research

Twenty acres of the farm will be leased to the Snake River Sugar Beet Growers Research Committee. This organization is leasing on behalf of the University of Idaho for rhizomania research. The principle investigator will be Dr. John Gallian, Extension Sugarbeet Specialist, Twin Falls. The annual payment will be \$10,000 (\$500/per acre) and the term of the lease is five years.

To conduct this research the 20 acres will be divided into test plots that are attractive and well maintained. Research will involve crop rotations and soil treatments. Further, the research area will be a site of field days and a place to demonstrate to national and international visitors.

Each year, two CSI student interns can work with the University of Idaho to gain applied scientific experience by conducting projects in experimental activities.

Grass Pasture Planned Activities

Jim Wilson plans to use the grass pasture area (next to North College Road) to raise rangeland plants, specialized flowers and forages, and harvest the seeds. He will be working with our agriculture student managers.

Wetland Activities

Ross Spackman plans to use the wetland to conduct research on water quality as part of his doctoral research project. The work will consist of studying how polyacrylamide (PAM) and wetlands function together to remove sediment, bacteria, nitrogen, and phosphorus from water flowing down the Perrine Coulee.

This year the Ag Department cosponsored Agri-Action 2000. As part of our responsibilities we allowed dealerships to conduct tractor demonstrations in the pasture area. The purpose was to increase community awareness of agriculture.

The wetland area continues to be popular for people and classes to visit and to use. Biology and agriculture classes use it an as outdoor laboratory.

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THE COLLEGE OF SOUTHERN IDAHO DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING POLICY

The State of Idaho has codified the procedure under which a political subdivision of the State of Idaho may test its employees for drugs or alcohol at Title 72, Chapter 17 of the Idaho Code. The Board of Trustees of the College of Southern Idaho has determined that it is in the best interests of the college, its administration, faculty and staff to **have** a drug and alcohol testing policy.

POLICY

The policy of the College of Southern Idaho, which may be amended at any time, is as follows:

The college may require any employee or prospective employee to submit to appropriate testing for the presence of drugs or alcohol in that employee's system under circumstances which may include

- a. post-accident
- b. return to duty
- c. follow-up
- d. reasonable suspicion

Post-accident:

Any employee whose performance either contributed to any accident or injury or cannot be completely discounted as a contributing factor to an accident will be tested based upon the following conditions:

- (a). If the accident caused injuries resulting in medical treatment being provided by a physician or his/her designee (other than first-aid).
- (b). If the accident resulted in significant property damage.

Return to duty/follow-up:

An employee who tests positive for drugs or alcohol may not return to work until such employee tests negative. The College of Southern Idaho has the option of disciplinary action up to and including termination for a confirmed positive test. When disciplinary action has been chosen as an option, the employee may return to duty when the following conditions, which may be at the employee's expense, are met:

- (a) The employee must have a negative return-to-duty test for drugs and/or alcohol as specified in this policy. The sample collection and analysis of the specimen must be conducted at the company's designated site. The sample must have been collected no more than 24 hours prior to the employee's return to work.
- (b) The employee must submit to an evaluation (a copy of which is sent to the employer) by the company's designated Substance Abuse Professional/Employee Assistance Program identifying:
 - i) Recommendations for treatment, if any.

- ii) A plan for follow-up drug/alcohol testing to be completed for a period of time not more than 60 months.
- iii) A signed agreement from the employee stipulating to his/her commitment to the outlined plan/recommendations.

Reasonable suspicion:

When trained supervisory personnel determine there is reasonable suspicion to believe an employee is under the influence, or in possession, of any substance prohibited by these standards or is otherwise in violation of this policy, the company may:

- (a) Require the employee to submit to a drug and/or alcohol test when at least one designated/trained supervisor has reasonable suspicion to believe that an employee is under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol. These beliefs will be based upon specific physical behavioral or performance indicators. A second witness, who is a trained supervisor, may observe and/or concur to make the decision to test.
- (b) Any illegal substance found on the premises will be turned over to appropriate law enforcement agencies and may result in criminal prosecution.

All employees and prospective employees are subject to the terms and conditions of this policy.

PROCEDURES

- 1. Any testing for drugs or alcohol on current employees will be considered work time for compensation purposes. Prospective employees shall not be paid for any time spent for drug/alcohol testing. The college shall pay all initial costs of drug or alcohol testing.
- 2. An employee does have the right to refuse to be tested. However, refusal to submit to the test may be grounds for disciplinary action up to and including termination.
- 3. Sample collection, testing and analysis for drugs or alcohol shall be performed with the Magic Valley Regional Medical Center as third party administrator and within the guidelines as set forth within SAMHSA and DHHS. MVRMC will assure validity, confidentiality and security of samples and test results. Sample selection and testing will conform to the above guidelines, including scientifically accepted analytical methods and procedures.
- 4. Any employee or prospective employee who tests positive for drugs or alcohol must be given written notice of that test result, including the type of substance involved. Any employee who tests positive for drugs or alcohol may not return to the work force until such employee tests negative. The employee must be given an opportunity to discuss and explain the positive test result with a medical review officer or other qualified person. If any test is positive for drugs and/or alcohol, CSI shall receive a confirmatory test before using the test result as a basis for any disciplinary action or termination.
- 5. Any employee or prospective employee who has a positive test result may request that the same sample be retested by a mutually agreed upon laboratory. A request for retest must be made within seven (7) working days from the date of the first confirmed positive test notification and be paid for by the employee or prospective employee requesting the test. If the retest results in a negative test outcome for an

- employee, the college will reimburse the cost of the retest, compensate the employee for his time if suspended without pay, or if terminated solely because of the positive test, the employee shall be reinstated with back pay.
- 6. Upon receipt of a confirmed positive drug or alcohol test result or other proof which indicates a violation of this policy, or upon the refusal of an employee to provide a test sample or upon an employee's alteration or attempt to alter a test sample, the college may use that test result or the employee's conduct as the basis for disciplinary or refusal-to-hire action that will result in claimant's ineligibility to receive benefits under the provisions of section 72-1336(4), (5), (6) or (7), Idaho Code. The college may require that the current employee utilize the return-to-work procedure as a condition of continued employment or reinstatement. Actions by the college may include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. **Per the evaluation of a substance abuse counselor,** the employee will enroll in a private employer-approved rehabilitation, treatment or counseling program, which may include additional drug or alcohol testing, as a condition of continued employment;
 - b. suspension of the employee with or without pay for a period of time;
 - c. termination of the employee;
 - d. other disciplinary measures as deemed appropriate by the college.
- 7. All information, interviews, reports, statements, memoranda or test results, written or otherwise, received through this substance abuse testing policy shall be considered confidential and kept in the medical files maintained by the Director of Human Resources.
- 8. This policy shall conform in all respects with the provisions of Title 72, Chapter 17, Idaho Code.
- 9. This policy shall not in any way create a physician-patient relationship with the College of Southern Idaho and a prospective or current employee.
- 10. If an employee tests positive for drugs or alcohol, such employee shall not be considered disabled by virtue of the test results alone.
- 11. All prospective and current employees will be fully informed of the Drug-Free Workplace Policy and procedures prior to any testing being administered. All employees will be provided with a copy of this policy. No current or prospective employee will be tested until this information is provided to him/her.

The College of Southern Idaho recognizes drug and alcohol dependency as a serious problem and as a health, safety and security threat to the business of education. Employees who need help in overcoming such dependency should contact their supervisor, the Employee Assistance Program or the Director of Human Resources. A voluntary, conscious effort to seek such assistance is encouraged.
