



# GENERAL EDUCATION CORE COURSES

Idaho's General Education III.N Policy establishes six statewide GEM (General Education Matriculation) competency areas, commonly referred to as "Ways of Knowing": Oral Communication, Written Communication, Mathematical, \*Scientific, \*Humanistic & Artistic, \*Social & Behavioral. (*\*Selections must be from 2 different disciplines. -4-letter codes must be different. For example, in the Humanistic & Artistic section, you CANNOT count two ARTS classes for the Ways of Knowing section.*) These courses are designed to be accepted and transferable between all participating Idaho Higher Education Institutions. In addition, a seventh category, "Institutionally Designated/Specific," which includes our GNED 101 & WELL courses.
