Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)

Nursing assistants are unlicensed personnel employed to perform basic nursing care services for the ill, injured, handicapped or disabled under the direction and supervision of licensed nurses in hospitals, nursing homes, private homes and other health care agencies and settings.

CNA Program Goals:

- Certified Nursing Assistant classes are offered each semester as either a work force development course (HWFE 102) or a course for six credits, working towards a Basic Technical Certificate (ALLH 102).
- Upon completing this course, students may take the Idaho nurse aid registry exams and enter the workforce.
- CNA certifications are either required or can earn extra points for students applying to other CTE programs in Health Sciences and Human Services at CSI.

Admittance Requirements:

Must have a complete and clear background check, a clear drug test, COVID and up-to-date vaccinations of TB and Flu (season permitting).

What to Know

Classes are 8 - 10 weeks in length with various schedules available. Hybrid as well as Face-to-Face classes are available. The HWFE class is \$840 plus cost of book \$30 - 85. The ALLH 102 class is current cost of a CSI credit x 6. The class is offered on the main campus as well as in off campus centers.

Schedule:

This course is available in Fall, Spring and Summer semesters. Day and evening courses available, M-F.
