

General Admission Requirements

Competitive admission requirements into the Radiologic Technology AAS program:

Age:

Applicant must be 18 years of age or older prior to the beginning of the first semester (to be able to attend the first clinical course RADT 180C Clinical Radiography).

Will need to submit either a valid state driver's license or birth certificate at the time of application on application form.

Advisor: A Health Science Student Success Advisor should be consulted prior to enrolling in any course.

Education:

An applicant must be a high school graduate, the equivalent (GED), and/or college graduate. Please submit high school or equivalent, submit to records@csi.edu. For official transcripts from college or universities submit to [National Student Clearinghouse](#).

- All courses must have been successfully completed with a "C" or better.
- Transferable degrees-must be from a regional or national accredited college, university, or other postsecondary institution recognized by the US Department of Education at the time the coursework was completed.

The following pre-admission courses must be completed before submitting your application. Grades need to be posted on transcripts that are submitted with application.

ENGL 101 Writing and Rhetoric I

MATH 143 Precalculus I or higher (must be within 5 years)

BIOL 227 and 227L Human Anatomy & Physiology 1 (must be within 5 years of application)

BIOL 228 and 228L Human Anatomy & Physiology 2 (must be within 5 years of application)

ALLH 101 Medical Terminology (must be within 5 years of application)

The following courses are required and can be taken up to the summer before beginning of program. If taking in summer semester of application year, must be registered for courses before submitting application.

COMM 101 Fundamentals of Oral Communication **or** COMM 209 Critical Thinking and Argumentation

PSYC 101 Introduction to Psychology **or** SOCY 101 Introduction to Sociology

If a course is repeated, only the last grade attempt is used in the pre-requisite gpa calculation.

Courses exempted or articulated do not carry GPA points.

TEAS TESTING

The Radiologic Technology program requires a minimum total adjusted individual score of 58.7% with results submitted with application.

The ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) is a timed exam that includes questions in the following areas: English, Math, Reading and Science. Applicants are strongly encouraged not to take the TEAS exam until completing A&P I and II OR at least completing some of A&P II. Will need to create an TEAS account before going to CSI Testing Center to complete the test. TEAS results will need to be uploaded to the application.

Applicants have two opportunities (within a 12-month period) to achieve this score or higher and must submit highest score by the application deadline. We strongly recommend that anyone who does not pass the TEAS on their first try undertake remediation before their second attempt.

Brainfuse Online Tutoring is a free resource paid for by College of Southern Idaho (CSI) to assist with the TEAS exam. Brainfuse is located in current student Canvas account.

The exam score is good for two years from the month and year of the exam.

Acceptance emails will be sent out via csi.edu emails:

Emails will be sent to notify students of their acceptance into the Radiologic Technology of the program.

The number of available openings in the Radiologic Technology Program varies based on the number of clinic slots in the program as a whole and may vary by campus space and semester. Program accreditation sets a specific number of admission seats for the Radiologic Technology competitive admission program.

Applicants are subject to the competitive admissions selection process for the Radiologic Technology Program.

Additional requirements (upon acceptance):

American Heart Association Healthcare Provider CPR Certification, (must not expire during duration of program.

Physical exam,

Criminal Background Check,

immunizations,

Drug Toxicology.

Note: Individuals who have been convicted of a felony offense may be denied licensure or certification.

Applications for state licensure are reviewed by the designated governing body or certification by the A.R.R.T... Licensure/Certification requirements may vary by state. Graduates of the program will submit application to The American Registry of Radiologic Technologists during the final semester of the program.

Students concerned about meeting the credentialing requirements of the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT) due to possible prior ethical violations involving felonies or misdemeanors that would otherwise need to be reported on the ARRT Application for Certification and Registration may want to complete the ARRT's [Ethical Review and Pre-Application Packet](#).
