Committee Reports

Ambassadors

Athletic Connection

I also have scheduled for this week a meeting with our director, the men's and women's basketball coach, and also the athletic photographer here on campus. We are looking at scheduling the men's basketball team for their videos on Saturday.

Campus Recreation

- Recreation Center Business: The Recreation Center Hired 14 new employees and they had a staff meeting that occurred this Saturday. They completed the new weight room, and it is now open for student use.
- o Recreation Center Membership: Total Members for summer 2010 were 733, and of those, 304 were students. Fall membership so far is at 323 people. More are expected to join as the semester progresses.
- o Attendance: The total attendance for spring and summer 5/10/10 - 8/28/10 was 12,119 times. Of those, 2,782 attendance times were from students.
- Events: Saturday Mackenzi Jasper's Senior Project for Filer High School 5K Run/Walk started at 8:00am. 100% of the

proceeds went to Dianne K. Bolt Breast Cancer Screening

Memorial Fund. Also there was a Rafting trip on the Hagerman portion of the Snake River from 10:00 am-2:00pm.
