- Advertising

  - On Wednesday the 27<sup>th</sup> we discussed community service projects and social events.
- Athletic Connection
  - This week Athletic Connect had their meeting with Joel Bates, Jason Vickery, Advisor Graydon Stanley, the ASCSI Student Body President Sheree Haggan and our Freshmen Senator Shanica Turner. We also went to Jerome and set up a booth for the Men's Basketball team to sell shirts. A special thank you to Senator Guity and Treasurer Chabuka for all of their help. We also had our Harlem Ambassador game on Saturday and had a booth set up to sell items for

this team. We helped them make about \$300 by selling shirts.

- Campus Recreation
  - Last week's membership was 1,668, and admittance was 1,331 people.
  - We had the Great Pumpkin Race on Saturday and that was a great success, we had over 200 people participate, and it was a lot of fun. The Halloween Carnival afterwards at the Rec-Center was very successful as well; there were about 500 people that came to that, so there was a great turnout.
  - Scott met with Program Board last Tuesday about the date night in the Rec-Center and they are going to do 4 movie nights in the Rec-center, he still has not heard a date from them, but the Rec-Center is going to provide workers, program board the movie, and the Triathlon club the concessions. Also it was approved that the tri club would get 50-50 on the raffles at the basket ball games. November 5<sup>th</sup> through 7<sup>th</sup> the Triathlon club will be doing a fund raiser at the Annual Harvest Time Festival. We will be selling giant pixie sticks and cotton candy.
  - Scott has been working on getting grants for equipment for the Fitness trail and he just got one! The Rec-Center is the recipient of \$5000 from the Saint Luke's Community Health Improvement Fund.
  - They have been winterizing the challenge course and doing the inventory. Also Ted Keys has been working on videos for every high element. There are six done now; eventually there will be twenty two. You can find them on YouTube if you type College of Southern Idaho Challenge Course.
  - I am doing a survey right now to see what events people would be most likely to participate in for the outdoor program so we can plan the events accordingly.
  - We have a couple activities planned for the Outdoor Program, night tubing at Magic Mountain December 5<sup>th</sup>, and a ski and snowboard trip December 11<sup>th</sup>. Also December 10<sup>th</sup> there will be a snowboarding movie, Deeper. We are tentatively planning a Hiking and Kayaking trip to Bruneau Sand Dunes on November 20<sup>th</sup>.
