- Advertising:
  - This week we printed the March Toilet Paper and calendar and did last touches to the posting policy.
- Ambassadors:
  - On March 2<sup>nd</sup> we talked about announcing the upcoming Senate elections.
  - We took our council picture on March 1<sup>st</sup> and everyone was there.
  - Girls and Technology was on Friday, March 4<sup>th</sup> and it turned out well.
- Athletic Connection:
  - This week we held the Regional Tournament and we worked at the games.
- Campus Recreation:
  - Admittance for the week was 1,264 people, and membership is at 3,185 people. We had 5 students go on the Snow shoeing trip; it was a lot of fun! I was pretty disappointed that we had no senators come and support the trip. Next Saturday there will be a backpacking and hiking trip at Malad Gorge State Park, the cost is \$5.00.
  - Last week I talked to Edit Szanto about getting the Rec-Center more accessible on the web page. This is not an option at this point, and so we are trying to get the rec-center more publicity through facebook, and also updating the Rec-Center board in the Taylor building to get better advertisement. I posted next week's hiking info on my facebook page and also in the senate group, and would like to get it out there to as many students as possible and moreover to raise the members of the rec-center page, so if you could please copy my posting and go to the rec-

- I also would like to do a social event with the Rec-Center. ## Old Business

- Change For Children: The committee heads shared information about the progress of their goals. President Haggan went over a

calendar for the Senators to follow as well. A motion was made to set \$12,000 as a goal for funds to be donated to the Refugee Center, and the motion was amended to \$10,000. The amended motion was approved. Senator Tapia was advised to modify the dance posters. Senator Federico made a motion to change the dance theme, but the motion was not seconded. Senator Hernandez made a motion to remove the words relating to Change for Children and the Refugee Center from the dance posters and the motion was approved. Senator Choate made a motion to table this discussion to March 14, 2011, and the motion was approved.

## **New Business**

- Resignation: Senator Aylissa Ramirez submitted a letter of resignation. She verbally recited her resignation. Senator Hernandez made a motion to approve the resignation and the Senate accepted.
- Elections: Vice President Butler passed around a sign-up sheet for the election booth downstairs. Being in Senate is not about the title, it is about service to the students. We need to remember this during campaign week just so we can represent Student Senate in a positive way. Be sure to stay positive during the elections and work to life up your competitors and not tear them down. We have had many complaints about candidates not running fairly. We will be getting in touch with those who have been complained about.
- Tuition & Fees: The administration gave three different options for tuition changes and the last Board meeting. Advisor Stanley asked the Senate to have a decision about which option they prefer by March 14, 2011.
  - Increase it to \$110 per credit.
  - Decrease it to \$100 per credit, but charge all students per credit they take. For example, a student taking 15 credits would pay \$1,500 instead of the current full-time rate.
  - Keep it at \$105 per credit, but start charging full-time students per credit once they surpass 15 credits instead of the current 16.
