# **Meeting Minutes**

- Sustainability:
  - Well-attended meeting

#### **VIII. Old Business**

  - (1) Senator Lewallen: only tip is that we need to better store our food for the event
  - (2) Senator Jensen: students were complaining about behavior at the dance, so my complaint is about how security really wasn't a big presence
    - (a) Also wanted to say that since the event was a senate event, he felt that senators should have helped set up *and* clean up instead of set up *or* clean up

- Vice President Vanhoozer: Program Board already contracted the band on the same date as the pasta feed
  - (1) Program Board may be interested in combining the event with us
- Senator Lewallen: having trouble getting ahold of Scott Farkus.
  - (1) Terry, a cook from last year, isn't certified but used to run a restaurant. He may help again this year.
  - (2) Last year, senate wore polos, hopefully we can have something this year again
  - (3) My committee, talk to me after the meeting
  - (4) Senator Donahue will try to get donations again like she did last year
  - (5) Senator Eddy: make sure all food received is not expired

### • Duct Tape the Dean

- Senator Martin filled out a proposal with Home Depot and Lowe's for donations of duct tape
  - (1) Will have more information in next week's meeting

- Vice President Vanhoozer: two weeks ago we approved my proposal that makes it so all senators give time

### **IX. New Business**

### Fun Run

- Senator Kruse: Senate would help put on a fun run
- President Lindley to Senator Kruse: Can you pick a senator that hasn't done an event yet to give them some experience?

### • Election Committee

- President Lindley: we've had elections in March, but I won't be back until the 10<sup>th</sup>
  - (1) I need senators to help advertise and set up the ballots and all that stuff
  - (2) Committee: Senators Lewallen, Donahue, Kruse, and Vogt
- Senator Lewallen: Get out there and tell people about it, we did not have much happening last year's elections
- Senator Etienne will work on an advertisement template

### • Eagle Hall

- President Lindley: we could let them just spend and then cover how much their deficit is at the end of the year
- Senator Lewallen: we should set a limit to them so they don't overspend a ton
- Senator Olson: we should table this for next meeting because we don't have Advisor Scholes here to tell us about our options
- Senator Donahue: their constitution says that \$300 is the maximum, they need to consider just giving their members less in scholarship money
- Senators Lewallen and Eddy will go to the council to get more information
- President Lindley: I don't want to choke out student involvement in the dorms for next year by taking away their scholarship money
- Senator Lewallen: it's great that we have that many people involved in this council, we shouldn't set them back just because their council grew.
- Senator Olson moved to table this discussion until next Monday's meeting (motion passed)

### • Senator Vogt's Proposal

- I have a few ideas in mind
- Jail Day Event April 1<sup>st</sup>
  - (1) Cadets go into class and arrest a student as a joke from another student
    - (a) Jail birds would have to raise money to get out of jail.
    - **(b)** A prize would be awarded to the jail bird who raised the most money
- Also in April. Spring Formal Event at Canyon Crest
  - (1) The facility is already open on the date and time that I'm considering
  - (2) All money would go the Refugee Center
  - (3) An advertiser could get posters going
  - (4) Hoping for a turnout of 75-100 people
  - (5) Looking at a date of the 26<sup>th</sup> or 27<sup>th</sup>
- Senators Mogensen and Elmer are already on the committee
- May Day Yard Sale
  - (1) Ski Swap and Twin Falls' largest yard sale are huge successes
  - (2) Looking at a date of the 9<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup>
- Senator Kruse: recommend talk to Advisor Scholes about legal issues involved with the Yard Sale
- Senator Vogt: just looking for senate's approval for all these events before getting too caught up in the details
