April is Community College Month.

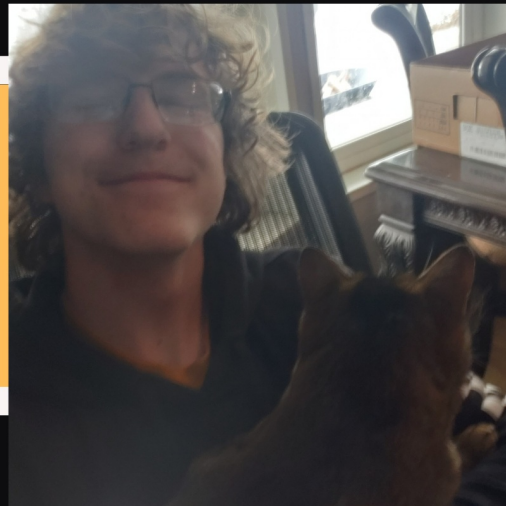
