The Title V Grant

To document CSI's

progress in meeting the objectives of the grant, CSI will identify a minimum of 10 general education courses as culturally responsive. A course identified as culturally responsive means the instructor has committed to working with the Teaching and Learning Center at CSI to intentionally modify pedagogy around the idea of cultural responsiveness. These courses have instructors who have agreed to participate in additional training and will document culturally responsive pedagogy occurring within their own classrooms. A course designated as culturally responsive reflects the instructor's participation in the grant. The designation does not affect course learning outcomes. CSI aims for all courses to provide quality educational, social, and cultural opportunities that meet the diverse needs of the communities we serve. Culturally responsive pedagogy courses are one step forward in realizing this goal.

Why is CSI learning more about culturally responsive pedagogy?

- To help students feel welcome and feel an increased sense of belonging here at CSI.
- To explore teaching methods that encourage active, connected learning.
- To discover more ways to meet the diverse needs of the communities we serve.

- Strategies for building welcoming classroom environments.
- Increased structures to encourage student participation and engagement with the course material.

How is culturally responsive pedagogy being implemented at CSI?

- Rethinking syllabus design to incorporate a welcoming and student-friendly tone.
- Clearly communicating to students that office hours are opportunities for students to seek additional feedback from instructors.
- Incorporating explanations of pedagogical decisions made within courses.
- Incorporating video content to welcome students to the course, walk students through how to use Canvas, and introduce new content or model expectations.
